Renting a bus, paying for equipment rental and a ski lesson, and feeding the hungry teenage skiers sounds like a substantial financial commitment, but now we can consider it.

Another thought is to take the students for a day at Watkins Glen. It is a beautiful gem in our state that not one of our students has visited. The glen walk is $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles long. Renting a bus to the park, taking the shuttle to the top of the glen, walking the magnificent trail (down a zillion steps) and feeding the hungry teenage hikers could potentially break the Consider College bank, but now we can consider it. The section board will deliberate and decide how to best use this gift.

All of our 11th graders are studying for the SAT exam either at an educational center, with their mentors, or at their individual high schools. They're all talking about college. I believe that for many of them college is still a nebulous concept, but we continue to discuss/cajole/

remind and pester our mentees to do well in school and plan for their future. Part of their future involves having confidence that they have seen places and done activities that their middle class peers have seen and done. Our ability to provide some of these opportunities for our students is enhanced by our benefactor's gift.
