The definition of a Renaissance woman is someone who has a wide range of abilities and interests. I could not think of anyone who better fits that definition than Karen Morris. Born in Watertown, New York, Karen came to Rochester early in her career. She is an attorney, a retired judge, a mentor, an educator, a community leader, a Big Sister and a great humanitarian.

Over her career, Karen was a part-time judge in Brighton Town Court and a distinguished professor of business law at Monroe Community College. She is a role model for her students and always wanted to make the law fun through her teaching. Some of her business law textbooks include Law Made Fun through Harry Potter's Adventures.

Karen is committed to helping the Rochester community through her volunteer work. She spearheaded "Ticket to Ride" an initiative that raises money to provide bus passes for criminal defendants to attend court-mandated hearings and programs. She has called the program one of her most significant accomplishments.

Her involvement in Monroe Community College has not been only as faculty member; she is also involved in DWIGHT (Doing What Is Good and Healthy Together.) This is a campus food pantry initiative created to support students in need of food with additional resources to help those that are having difficulties making ends meet.

Karen's compassion for others has led her to being a community partner for the youth Big Sister program in 1994 where she became a Big Sister to Jamie. Her relationship with Jamie is still strong. Karen was honored for her service and participation in this program in 1995 and 1998.

As part of a Kiwanis project, Karen plays a Santa's helper and sometimes even Santa for various charitable agencies. Karen is also a practicing magician. She continues to learn the tricks of the trade and loves entertaining children with her magical tricks.

This award is presented to an individual who has shown interest and involvement in the organization and has demonstrated the ability to lead and develop leadership in others. The recipient must also be able to communicate the work of NCJW to the membership and the community. As an advocate of social justice, a leader, fundraiser, mentor, and ambassador extraordinaire for NCJW, nobody does it better than Amy Stein.

As a past president of the Greater Rochester Section of NCJW, Amy continues to be an active board member, and has been honored to serve on the National Board of the Council of Jewish Women. When asked to share her proudest accomplishments with NCJW, Amy remarked that she is most proud of bringing new people into the organization and expanding the membership. She values being able to encourage people to "use their voices" and loves mentoring people, helping them become the best they

can be.

Additionally, Amy is on the board of Rochester's LACE (Language Acquisition and Cultural Exchange), a nonprofit organization whose goal is to bring English language learning directly to the community where new Americans live and work.

Currently, employed as the Executive Director of the Rochester Education Foundation (REF), Amy is responsible for carrying out the organization's mission to provide programs and resources to improve learning and success for all of the students in the Rochester City School District.

Amy shares her busy life with her husband, Peter, Senior Rabbi at Temple B'rith Kodesh, and their two grown children, Eliana and Ari. She enjoys reading, walking in nature, traveling, and meeting people with stories.


