



PUBLIC AFFAIRS

The Public Affairs Committee has been busy this summer! We've held six letter writing parties, which we kicked off in Susan B. Anthony's home in April, and written more than 1,000 letters encouraging people to vote! Thank you to **Arlene Schenker** and **Vancy Boyar** for spearheading this initiative and hosting parties, along with **Rikki Brodsky** and **Barbara Orenstein**.

We partnered with **NCJW NY** and **New Yorkers for Equal Rights** in phone banking to spread the word about the Equal Rights Amendment (Proposition 1). Make sure you turn your ballot over and vote YES on this amendment to the NYS Constitution, which will take an important step towards protecting our rights and reproductive freedoms, and will close dangerous loopholes that leave us open to extreme laws from extreme politicians. Head to our Instagram and Facebook pages to find some easily shareable graphics about the ERA by **Joel Rosen**, and make sure to share this message with your networks!

We're well underway planning our next event - an NCJW Community Shabbat Dinner on Friday, November 8th. As New York Times Opinion Columnist Bret Stephens said when he spoke at the JCC this spring, "The answer to antisemitism is Jewish pride." Our committee felt that the best way to respond to the current climate is to continue to be loudly and proudly Jewish. I hope you will join us for this event - stay tuned for more details soon!

EQUAL RIGHTS AMENDMENT

An Amendment to Guarantee Protections for All New Yorkers

WHAT TO KNOW:

Right now, New York's State Constitution does not protect all New Yorkers — for example, pregnant New Yorkers, women, LGBTQIA+ people, those with disabilities, older adults, and people from different countries and cultures.

We need a constitutional amendment so our rights and freedoms are protected – no matter who is in office.

The New York ERA would:

- explicitly prohibit discrimination by the government based on a person's ethnicity, national origin, age, disability, and sex — including their sexual orientation, gender identity, and gender expression — in addition to pregnancy, pregnancy outcomes.
- * add to existing protections against discrimination based on race and religion.
- * ensure New York's Constitution includes the strongest legal protections for all New Yorkers.

New Yorkers will have the opportunity to vote on the Amendment in November, 2024. If voters approve it, the ERA will be added to New York's State Constitution.







Community Connections Committee Kicks Off the Year

The CCC started the year strong, leaning into a favorite service project. In mid-September members gathered at the Brighton Food Cupboard to pack Rosh Hashanah bags for community members in need. This time, to accommodate members' schedules, we added an evening volunteer time in addition the afternoon slot. The assembled baskets were brought to homes by both NCJW GRS members and community members. In some cases, personal connections were made with the recipients. This marks our third volunteer effort with the Brighton Food Cupboard; previous events involved assembling Chanukah and Passover baskets.

This past year we also we toured the Brighton Food Cupboard's impressive new facility at Temple B'rith Kodesh.

In response to leadership requests for awareness of allergy dangers when serving food at our events, two CCC members held a training session for the local Board of Directors. The session focused preparing and serving food while being mindful of hidden allergens like nuts, gluten, and dairy. When in doubt, just ask someone who manages these challenges daily. That's the best way to ensure you're offering the safest options in the safest way.


Lately, the CCC has been all about food but our interests go beyond that! This year, join us for possible projects with refugees, book collections for City school kids and

UPDATE


The central call to action for National Council of Jewish Women (NCJW) is, "Justice, Justice Shall You Pursue" (Deuteronomy 16:20). Founded in 1893, we are the oldest Jewish women's grassroots organization in the country and are continually guided by Jewish values that call on us to improve the lives of the most vulnerable women, children, and families. We work both in the United States and Israel to achieve this goal.

Our 225,000 members, 49 sections, State Policy Advocacy Network, and seven Action Teams use our Theory of Change to accomplish this: meaningful education, combined with progressive and feminist advocacy, and dedicated community service results in impactful transformation on local, state, and federal levels.

NCJW GRS has been a strong leader within this larger organization for 130 years. Over this past






PAST EVENTS
